HighWire releases COUNTER 4 Usage Reports


HighWire Press, host of GSL's journals, have released COUNTER 4 usage reports to libraries.

Transactions of the Geological Society of Glasgow now available on Lyell



These historical transactions, only available online through the Lyell Collection, reflect the geological themes and ideas of geologists of the time. Published between 1860 and 1963 the Transactions include papers by Croll, Geikie, Gregory, Holmes, Lapworth, McCallien, Thomson (later Lord Kelvin), Tyrrell, Richey and others whose seminal works provided important geological

ideas.

The title was eventually superseded by the Scottish Journal of Geology in 1965, when the Transactions of the Geological Society of Glasgow merged with the Transactions of the Edinburgh Geological Society.

Complete print sets of the Transactions of the Geological Society of Glasgow are now rare but these online versions, are now available in the [Lyell Collection](#) for the first time. They are fascinating reading for geologists and scholars of the history of geology.

GSL Fellows among UK's leading practising scientists



Seven Geological Society of London Fellows, including two former Presidents, have been named on the Science Council's list of the UK's 100 leading professional scientists.

Launched to celebrate the Science Council's 10th birthday, the competition has been held to recognise the many different ways professional scientists contribute to UK society.

Professor Jane Francis, Director of the British Antarctic Survey, who uses fossil plants to study past climate, and Professor James Jackson, who researches active continental tectonics at the University of Cambridge, are listed in the 'explorer' category of scientists, which recognises those on 'a journey of discovery.' Tricia Henton, a leading environmental geoscientist, is recognised for her work in contaminated land and hydrogeology, whilst Sir Mark Moody-Stuart, former GSL President, former Chairman of the Shell Group and non executive director of Anglo American, is recognised for his work in business, and his advocacy of corporate responsibility and action on climate change. Dr Andrew Mackenzie, Chief Executive Officer of BHP Billiton, is also recognised for his work in business, whilst Dr Alan Gibbs, Director and Founder of the company Midland Valley is listed in the 'entrepreneur' category. Lord Ron Oxburgh, former GSL President and President of the Carbon Capture and Storage Association, is recognised as a champion of alternative energy sources and the move to a low-carbon economy, and his commitment to the intersection of government and science.

Online First is now available for Scottish Journal of Geology (SJG), Proceedings of the Yorkshire Geological Society (PYGS) and Journal of Micropalaeontology (JM).

Online First is a feature offered through the Geological Society's electronic content platform, the [Lyell Collection](#), enabling articles to appear online soon after they have been accepted for publication and ahead of the printed volume or issue. 
The AGG plans to commission a Special Publication on key issues in Arctic Geoscience to stimulate engagement in the new group.


SP392 Tectonic Evolution of the Oman Mountains


SP382 Isotopic Studies in Cretaceous Research


SP385 Orogenic Andesites and Crustal Growth


